# OXE 388: POLITICAL PARTIES & ELECTIONS IN THE U.K. AND IRELAND

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course centers on two crucial components of the U.K. and Irish political systems: political parties and elections.

We will also examine the topic of "Politics and Art," which will match up with our excursions to London art museums and attendance at theatrical performances, We will also examine the lives and works of Karl Marx & Frederich Engels when they lived in London, dovetailing with our visits to the British Museum and Highgate Cemetery.

Note: 'Political Parties & Elections' is designed to complement Andrew Whitehead's 'Contemporary British Politics" course." Students are required to sign up for both of these classes, as part of the GEO's 'Politics in London' summer program.

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

The course aims to analyze political parties and elections in both the U.K. and the Republic of Ireland. It will provide students with the analytical tools to compare and contrast the electoral systems of both countries, as well as the more decentralized aspect of political parties. This class will also include weekly film showings and excursions.

### **RULES AND PROCEDURES**

Attendance at all class sessions, films, and excursions is required. Students are also expected to be prepared for all classes and to contribute to discussions.

## FILMS AND EXCURSIONS:

The course also includes weekly films and excursions. These include:

- A guided tour of the Houses of Parliament at Westminster and walk to 10 Downing Street (PM's residence)
- A visit to the British Museum, & Highgate Cemetery, with an emphasis on the years that Friedrich Engels & Karl Marx lived in London
- A visit to the Tate Britain and the Courtard museums.
- A trip to Manchester or Cardiff, Wales
- Two plays, one of them at the Globe Theater

#### **POWERPOINTS:**

There will be two PowerPoints posted on Canvas; the first will material prior to the midterm exam, and the second one for the final exam.

#### **REQUIRED READING:**

On-line articles and book chapters and material on the PowerPoints

# **METHOD OF EVALUATION (GRADING)**
