### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Ital 201 course builds on the linguistic skills covered in the previous levels, introducing the most complex structures of Italian language. The students will be taught not only the linguistic system, but will also be given strategies and techniques that facilitate the learning process.

### **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

Review linguistic skills learned in previous levels.

Learn new strategies and techniques to further advance the learning and skill acquisition process.

Specific skill acquisition outcomes:

- The student will acquire a solid knowledge of the basic structure of previous levels.
- These will be integrated with more complex notions, which will allow them to have a satisfactory conversation with native Italians about their lives and costumes and interact in everyday life.
- The student will be able to write more complex texts about their present and past such as a diary and
- read plane articles and other authentic materials.
- They will be also able to talk about their future, give polite suggestions, expressing their opinions in more sophisticated way, etc.



#### INSTRUCTIONAL METHODOLOGY

The course utilizes an integrated communication method that puts the student at the center of the learning process in a cooperative relationship with the teacher. Grammatical theory will always be connected with the practical use of the language. All of the didactic materials used throughout the course, such as textbooks and multimedia devices, are in Italian.

Students will work in groups, be asked to take part in role-plays, write papers, dialogue with other students and the teacher. Constant interaction in Italian is the core of the learning process.
