- 6. Comprehensive risk management overseen by GEO staff in Oregon with protocols developed in collaboration with UO Risk Services; experienced directors on-site to work closely with GEO staff and students on all health and safety issues that may arise.
- 7. Access to GEO Scholarships such as the Ambassador Scholarship (\$1,000 award) and the Map your Future Scholarship (\$1,000), a freshman planning award.
- 8. Staff and faculty are eligible for development grants that support visits to GEO centers abroad and exploration of future customized programming.
