

## FACULTY-LED PROPOSALS SYLLABUS CHECKLIST

For GEO Faculty-Led program proposals, please make sure any syllabi you submit include the following details:

- ✓ Course Information (title, instructor name(s), language of instruction, site ity and country, UO credits, contact hours)
- ✓ **Student Engagement Hours** (total number of hours of in all course activities)
- ✓ **Course Description** (100 words or less, where possible)
- ✓ Course Objectives (instructional goals and student outcomes)
- ✓ Instructional Methodology (lecture, seminar, discussions, guest lectures, experiential education, etc.)
- ✓ Method of Evaluation (exams, projects, papers, journals, participation, quizzes, etc.)
- ✓ **Course Outline** (how students will engage with the course topic through readings and assignments)
- ✓ **Course Readings** (please list required readings and suggested readings separately)
- ✓ **Bibliography** (cite references for lectures or course design)
- ✓ Accessible Education Statement (see <u>https://aec.uoregon.edu/best-practices-faculty</u> for more information): The University of Oregon is working to create inclusive learning environments. Please notify me if there are aspects of the instruction or design of this course that result in disability-related barriers to your participation.
