

ARGENTINA

Internship and Independent Research in Rosario

Fall Quarter

Students can choose an internship or research placement in Rosario. Interns work side-by-side with Argentine nationals, allowing a unique insight into the professional life of Rosarinos while earning 2-4 quarter credits or 1 semester credit. Placements are available in the fields of human rights, publishing and journalism, public relations and marketing, education, healthcare and tourism. Individualized research plans can also be developed to assist students in exploring career goals, applying theory and improving Spanish proficiency.

Spanish Language and Society in Rosario

Fall Quarter

Ideal for students who want to take a combination of upper division courses in Spanish language and linguistics, explore courses in Argentine culture, and do an internship or independent research. The program includes a cultural orientation in Buenos Aires, excursions to other Argentine cities, and historic and cultural activities within Rosario.

AUSTRALIA

University of the Sunshine Coast – **NEW!**

Year; Fall Semester; Spring Semester

Students enroll directly in courses alongside locals at the University of the Sunshine Coast, a public Australian university serving 12,000 students and located about 55 miles north of the city of Brisbane. Students can choose courses, or earn a focused topic diploma (a recognized Australian qualification), in business, communication, environmental studies, social sciences, sport and fitness, science, health and more. Students have access to vibrant outdoor sport opportunities in a variety of ecosystems, from subtropical rainforests to mountains to ocean. Students should be aware that semesters in Australia run on the following schedule: late February to June (Fall Semester/Semester 1), and mid-July to late November (Spring Semester/Semester 2).

CHINA

Global China Program at East China Normal University

Fall Semester; Spring Semester

Situated in the cosmopolitan city of Shanghai, East China Normal University (ECNU) was established in 1951, and is one of China's most highly-ranked and prestigious universities. Enjoy this vibrant and dynamic city while studying at ECNU's "garden campus." The 15-week semester program offers content courses in English, as well as Chinese language instruction for students at all levels, from beginning through advanced.

FRANCE

French Immersion in Angers

Year; Any Semester or Quarter

This is a full immersion French language program that also allows students to learn about French culture, politics and society. Students study intensive French at the international language institute (CIDEF) of the Université Catholique de l'Ouest, taking courses with US and other international students. They can also take history, philosophy, art, business, political science and literature courses in French.

GHANA

Global Health, Development and Service-Learning in Accra

Fall Semester

Study global health and development issues in an African context, as well as contemporary issues facing Ghanaian society. As a complement to coursework, students receive an introduction to Modern Twi, the most commonly spoken local language, as well as a placement in a service-learning/internship experience at a local community organization, research institute or healthcare service provider. Gain insights into Ghana's culture and history by living in a homestay and visiting the Cape Coast, Kumasi and the Volta region, in addition to the "slave castles" of the Gold Coast.

ITALY

Architecture in Vicenza

Spring Quarter

This program begins in Rome with a two-week study tour that includes Siena, Florence and Bologna before taking up residence for eight weeks in Vicenza, where the focus will be on the design studio. Traveling, and then living in an Italian town offers a rich cultural experience, enhanced by academic coursework and focused design practice. Students will also take an excursion to Switzerland and nearby countries for further comparative architectural studies.

Food and Culture in Siena

Spring Quarter

Develop fuller understandings of complex food-related issues and gain new insights into the ways in which food mediates social, political, environmental, cultural and economic processes. Students study Italian food and culture in the contexts of Siena and Tuscany, famous for their beautiful landscapes, quality of cuisine and wine, and as the birthplace of the agritourism movement. Suitable for all majors.

Language and Culture in Siena

Fall Quarter; Spring Quarter

This program offers Italian language courses at the beginning, intermediate and advanced levels, as well as an immersive local environment for students to practice language skills. Additional course offerings may include art history, political science, history, economics, communications, anthropology, food and culture and more. Service-learning options are also available to deepen connections to the local community.

Media Studies in Siena

Spring Quarter

Gain a broad understanding of Italian history and culture by investigating signs, symbols, and the intersection of art and science through course readings and reflective writing. Course-related excursions include sites of cultural and historical significance, as well as the landscape and museums of Tuscany and the city of Siena itself. Students can also opt to study Italian and/or participate in a service-learning project to deepen cultural understanding.

Pre-Business in Siena

Spring Quarter

This program offers courses to fulfill pre-business and general education requirements, including introductory statistics and macroeconomics courses, along with additional options that may include art history, political science, history, communications, anthropology, food and culture, and Italian language. Students can also opt to participate in service-learning projects to deepen cultural understanding.

Stones and Stories: Trekking Italian Landscapes in Siena

Spring Quarter

Explore the natural and social history of the Via Francigena, the medieval European pilgrimage trail, through the literature of Italo Calvino and travelers of the trail. Students will also explore themes related to the Via Francigena and Italian culture through newspaper and magazine readings. Excursions will take students on short hikes along the trail near Siena, where they will study and live in shared apartments.

MULTI-SITE

Service Learning in Segovia and Fes: Immigration, Nationalism and Border Politics

Spring Semester

As you participate in Segovia's spring semester Spanish language program, learn firsthand about the immigration challenges and border politics that face Spain and Morocco. Service-learning placements are arranged for students in both countries. Live with host families in the picturesque city of Segovia, a short distance from Madrid, and in vibrant Fes, the second largest city in Morocco and home to the world's largest car-free urban area: the old Medina. Students will also take a Survival (Moroccan) Arabic class in Fes.

SPAIN

Spanish Immersion in Oviedo

Year; Fall Quarter; Spring Semester

Advance your Spanish skills (whether beginning, intermediate, or advanced) by taking courses at the ELE language institute of the University and living with a host family. Oviedo is a great place to experience Spanish culture and learn more about the art, history, cuisine and music of the north coastal region. Students can apply Spanish language skills outside the classroom and gain invaluable experience by taking part in community service with local schools and NGOs.

Spanish Language and Culture in Segovia

Year; Fall Semester; Spring Semester

Designed for intermediate and advanced language levels, students take courses at GEO's center in Segovia, a picturesque city only 25 minutes by high-speed train from Spain's capital, Madrid. Students take language courses and other classes in art history, European studies, history, literature while living in a homestay to further support immersion into Spanish society and culture. Internships and service learning placements are also available for students seeking hands-on experience and a unique perspective on Spanish life.

UNITED KINGDOM

Gender, Race and Class in London

Fall Semester

A case study in interlocking social differences and structures of power, London is the perfect place to explore the workings of gender, race, and social class in history, society, art, architecture, science and religion. Students will see and experience how gender and class work in this dynamic and diverse city against the backdrop of Jack-the-Ripper's Whitechapel, untold LGBTQ stories behind artifacts in the Victoria & Albert Museum and the posh Mayfair district.

Global Business in London (with internship)

Spring Quarter

This program is a rigorous and exciting opportunity to engage in a customized internship while living in the heart of London, a leading financial center, with professors who are experts in world markets in transition. In addition to the internship, students take two or three upper division business courses in leadership, entrepreneurship, management, and culture. The program is supplemented by a range of class excursions that turn London itself into the classroom, and students will live in shared apartments in the heart of this bustling metropolis.

Liberal Arts in London (with internship)

Year; Fall Semester; Spring Semester

This program offers experiential learning in liberal arts and humanities. London itself becomes the classroom as instructors take advantage of world-class galleries and museums, such as the National Portrait Gallery, Tate Modern, the Churchill Museums and British Museum (a short walk from the GEO London Centre). Customized internships in fields such as business, fashion marketing, finance and many other areas of study are available to qualified students committed to gaining a unique perspective into British life. Excursions to surrounding areas include renowned destinations such as Edinburgh, Cambridge, Oxford, Stratford upon Avon and Wales.

Psychology in London (with internship) – **NEW!**

Spring Quarter

Study in London, the birthplace of attachment theory and home to Anna Freud. Students will earn upper division psychology credit in their coursework, while taking part in a customized psychology internship placement tailored to individual interests. London serves as both classroom and home, with students living in shared apartments and taking advantage of multiple excursions tied to academic coursework.
